In this hunt, kids **LISTEN** for Easter eggs

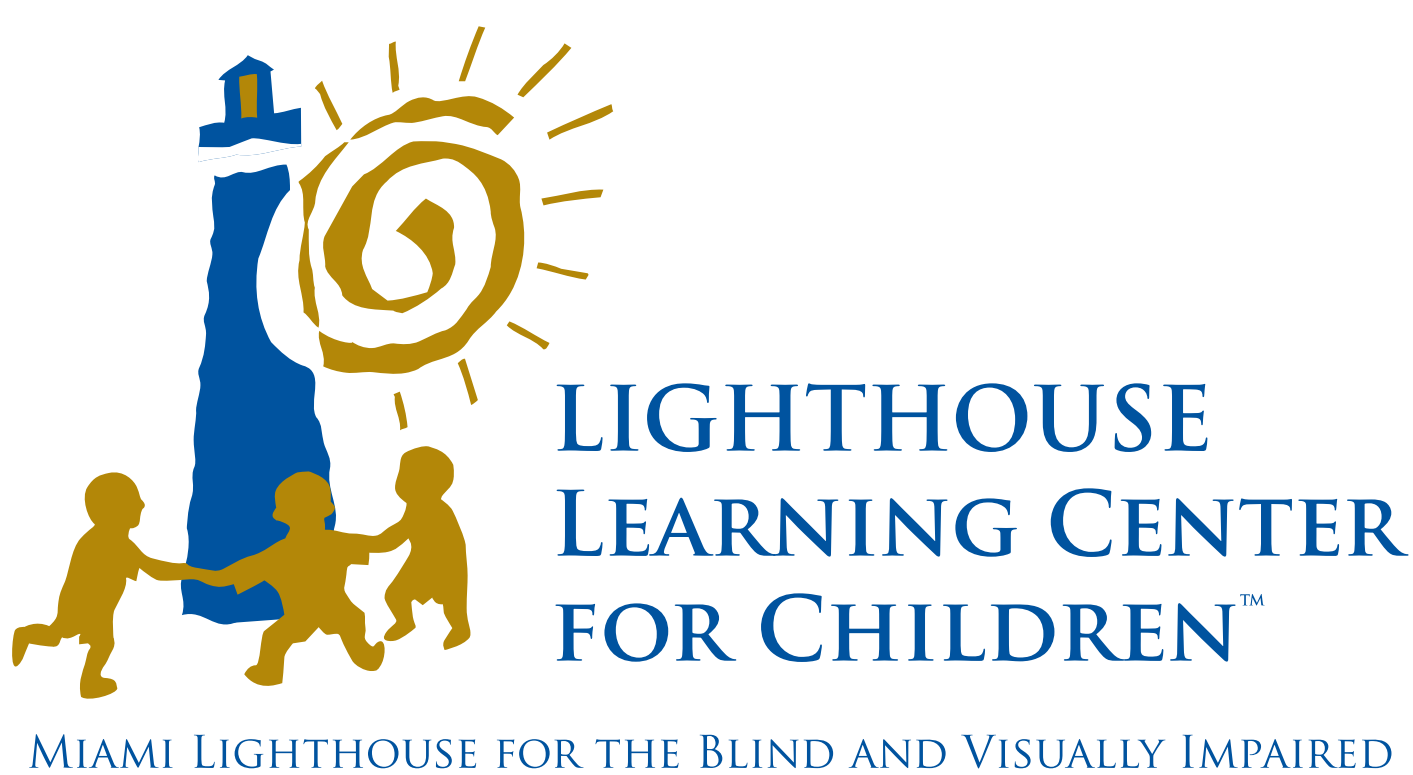
Students at the Miami Lighthouse Learning Center for Children™ enjoyed a holiday tradition of searching for Easter eggs hidden by the “Easter Bunny.” But this hunt – held at the campus garden of Miami Lighthouse for the Blind and Visually Impaired at 601 SW Eighth Avenue in Miami last Monday – had a twist: the brightly-colored eggs the children searched for emitted beeps as well. Kids found the eggs by listening for the sounds they made. The Miami-Dade Police Department, which built the beeping eggs, sponsored the event, along with the South Florida Police Benevolent Association.
