


This project was commissioned by the Miami Lighthouse for the Blind and Visually Impaired to determine if the presidential candidates' websites were accessible to the blind.

Key Findings:

- None of the websites were compliant with the American with Disabilities Act.
- None of the candidates had an accessibility statement that provides a method of contact including a live email address and phone number that users can call for assistance.
- Candidate websites did not allow users to easily adjust color and font size.

CRITERIA:

- · Is website organized for ease of navigation?
- · Are headings appropriately structured?
- Do logos and links have descriptive alt text?
- · Can users select active links with keystroke commands?
- · Can users control changing images?
- · Does site have play/pause video controls?
- · Are users able to adjust color and font size?
- Can users easily fill out forms on site?Can users access error messages?
- Is there a commitment statement to website accessibility?
