Employing nationally recognized best practices and evidence-based curricula, services for people throughout Miami-Dade County cover all ages ranging from early intervention for blind babies and Pre-Kindergarten for three- and four-yearold children to low vision rehabilitation for seniors. Our subsidiary, Florida Heiken Children's Vision Program, provides free eye care to underserved children throughout Florida. In 2017, Miami Lighthouse served over 16,000 individuals.
